SERVICE NOTES FOR THE 4TH SUNDAY IN LENT

The repentant sinner rejoices at being found in the loving embrace of the Father's full, free, and "foolish" forgiveness. Even though our sin should separate us from the family of God, he welcomes us back into the family with the full rights sons. To the self-righteous, this seems foolish, even offensive. But for the loving Father this is cause for celebration.

LAETARE SUNDAY

Historically, the Fourth Sunday in Lent has been called *Laetare Sunday*. "Laetare" is Latin for, "rejoice," and is the first word in the *Introit*, (* see note at the bottom of the next page; see also pg. 5). This Sunday has been viewed as a sort of respite from the sorrowful season of Lent. This Sunday also marks the halfway point to Good Friday, and is the first time Jerusalem is mentioned in the Divine Service during Lent. We can see the end of Jesus' time on earth approaching as we near Jerusalem.

HOLY COMMUNION IS OFFERED TODAY



In Holy Communion, we share in the mystery of the bread and wine offered together with the body and blood of Christ. As Christians who believe that the Bible is inspired by God and that every word written in it is God's holy Word, we believe that we receive the body and blood in, with, and under the bread and wine.

While this is something that goes beyond our human understanding, our faith allows us to accept this as true. God warns us in the Bible that anyone who doesn't understand this teaching or who denies this real presence of Christ's body and blood will do damage to his or her soul if not taught first.

As a congregation we care about people and about the spiritual well-being of individuals, especially those attending the Lord's Table this morning. If you are a guest and desire to commune, please speak to the pastor before the service. Our altar is open to those who confess oneness with us in doctrine, are not under church discipline in another congregation, and are members of our congregation, one of our sister congregations in the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod [WELS], or a member of our sister synod, the Evangelical Lutheran Synod [ELS].

^{*} Traditionally, the Divine Service begins in the rear of the church nave. The Invocation ("In the name of the Father..."), Confession & Absolution, and the Kyrie ("Lord, have mercy...") are said from the back of the church. Then, the Introit, which means "entrance," is spoken or sung as the pastor(s) enter the sanctuary in procession (usually with a processional cross/crucifix and candles). The service would then continue with the first of two "services" or rites in the Divine Service:

⁽¹⁾ the SERVICE OF THE WORD (see pg. 5), which includes the Salutation ("The Lord be with you..."), the assigned readings for the Day, the Psalm of the Day, the Verse of the Day, the Hymn of the Day, and the Sermon; (2) and then, the SERVICE OF THE SACRAMENT (see pg. 13), which includes the Salutation again, the Proper Preface ("It is truly good and right that we should at all times, and at all places..."), the Sanctus ("Holy..."), the Prayer of Thanksgiving, the Lord's Prayer, the Words of Consecration, the Agnus Dei ("Lamb of God..."), and the distribution.



THE DIVINE SERVICE

OPENING HYMN

INVOCATION

CONFESSION OF SINS

- M If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.
- But if we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our 1 John 1:8,9 sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.
- M God invites us to come into his presence and worship him with humble and penitent hearts. Therefore, let us acknowledge our sinfulness and ask him to forgive us.

Silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination.

Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful, and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

¹ The name of the Triune God and the sign of the cross reminds worshipers of their baptisms. Martin Luther wrote in his Small Catechism, "In the morning when you get up, make the sign of the holy cross and say, 'In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.'"



ABSOLUTION

- M God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son ♣ and of the Holy Spirit.





His father came out and entreated him, ²⁹ but he answered his father, 'Look, these many years I have served you, and I never disobeyed your command, yet you never gave me a young goat, that I might celebrate with my friends. ³⁰ But when this son of yours came, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fattened calf for him!' ³¹ And he said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. ³² It was fitting to celebrate and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found.'"


